STICK IT TO CANCER 2019 - EVERYTHING YOU NEED TO KNOW



What is Stick it to Cancer?

'Stick it to Cancer' (SITC) is a fun hockey tournament designed to raise funds for Maggie's. SITC will offer hockey teams the opportunity to participate in a Round Robin tournament. Teams are encouraged to dress as a super heroes and villains to unite in the fight against cancer. In addition to the festival there will be an after party at Eastside on George Street in Edinburgh.

When is it?

Saturday 2nd July. Registration is 9.00 – 9.30am with the first fixture starting at 10.00am. The tournament will run to 5.00pm. The evening celebration will start at 7.00pm and finish at 1.00am.

Where is it?

The hockey tournament will be at Edinburgh Academy's Hockey pitches on East Fettes Avenue. The evening celebrations will take place at Eastside on George Street in Edinburgh.

Who can play?

Anyone aged 14+. Each team can have 10 registered players. This is a mixed tournament for all abilities. Please note the after party is only open to participants aged 18+ Sorry!

How do I get involved?

Enter as a team or an individual on our website (<u>fucancer.co.uk/stick-it-to-cancer</u>) by **Friday 23rd June**. The cost of entry is £200 per team and is paid at the time of entry on the website. If you cannot enter online, please contact heather@fucancer.co.uk.

How much does it cost?

The cost of entry is £200 per team of up to 10 players.

I don't have a team - can I still take part?

YES! If you haven't got a team but are keen to get involved please let us know and we will do our best to add you to one. The cost of entry as a single player is £20 per person and your can enter on the website (<u>fucancer.co.uk/stick-it-to-cancer</u>). If you cannot enter online, or you don't have a team yet, please contact heather@fucancer.co.uk.

What do I need to take part?

You are expected to provide your own equipment. We would advise to wear shin pads, gum shield and appropriate sports clothing. Please see the rules regarding goalkeeper requirements. Balls will be supplied. Don't forget your stick and remember fancy dress is encouraged!

WHY DO IT?

All the money raised through SITC will go to Maggie's Cancer Centre in Edinburgh. Maggie's provides free practical, emotional and social support to people with cancer and their family and friends.

STICK IT TO CANCER – HOCKEY FESTIVAL RULES



- 1. 7 a side teams with a maximum of 10 players per squad. Games will be 20 minutes one way.
- 2A. NO CORNERS. A free hit will be taken from 5 metres outside the edge of the circle. Team on offense: The ball must go 5 metres before taking a shot on goal. Player can go 5 meters by either dribbling or passing to teammate.
- 2B. Long corners will be taken from the side line.
- 3. Goalkeepers If a team does not have a goalkeeper, they have 2 options
 - A. They can play with a kicking back. The kicking back must wear a shirt of a colour different from either team.
 - B. If the team you are playing against agrees prior to the start of the game, you may pick-up a goalkeeper from another team.
- 4. Each team must have a minimum of 2 female players on the pitch at any time.
- 5. Umpires are responsible for providing scores to the pitch manager. The score sheets must be verified by both teams and returned to Top Desk.
- 6. Standings will be determined using the following point system:
 - √ 3 points for a win
 - √ 1 point for a tie
 - √ 0 points for a loss
- 7. Protests regarding umpire decisions are not allowed. Questions or concerns about all other aspects of the tournament shall be brought to the Top Desk and will be addressed/resolved.
- 8. If two or more teams are tied for determining standings, the determining factors will be as follows:
 - A. The result of the match between the tied teams (Head to Head)
 - B. Fewest goals conceded
 - C. Most goals scored.

If teams remain tied, seeding will be determined by penalty strokes. Each team will be allowed 3 players for strokes.

- 9. Each team is responsible for nominating an umpire to officiate a number of games on the day
- 10. The ball must be played below waist height. Only when 1 on 1 with a keeper can the ball be raised at goal.
- 11. This is a fun tournament! We encourage all players and spectators to participate fully and be respectful towards umpires and event staff.





By entering the tournament, you are entering into the following agreement:

I hereby waive any and all claims that I or my team may have against the event organisers and release the event organisers from any claims that I or my team may have for personal injuries sustained as a result of participating in the Stick it to Cancer Hockey Festival, whether accidental or intentional. Furthermore, my team and I understand, appreciate and assume the risk of injury while participating in the Stick it to Cancer Hockey Festival and that we are voluntarily and deliberately exposing ourselves to the danger of injury while participating in the Stick it to Cancer Hockey Festival, and that we are barred from recovery against the event organisers. My team and I further indemnify the event organisers for any of my actions, whether accidental or intentional, that occur during our participation in the Stick it to Cancer Hockey Festival.
